



#### About this resource...

These activities are designed to offer fun, engaging, and interactive ways to practice color recognition and color words. This resource includes 15 different activities to practice colors.


You can use these activities as morning work bins, fast finisher activities, small group work, or as independent math stations. These activities require basic classroom supplies such as plastic math cubes, plastic bears, dry erase markers, play dough, clothes pins, and mini erasers {if you have them}.

Before adding these activities to independent stations you'll want to teach students how to complete each activity correctly.




### Color Mats

Print and laminate or slide in a page protector. Students will identify the color word and then use mini erasers, play dough, or other small manipulatives to form the color word.




## Play Dough Pictures

Print and laminate or slide in a page protector. Students will identify the color and use play dough to form snakes and make the pictures.



## Counting Color Mats


Print and laminate or slide in a page protector. Students will identify the color and use play dough to form balls to place on the activity mat.



### Color Word Sort

Place the headers in a pocket chart. Students will identify the color of each picture and match it with the correct header.

You could also have students play a color matching game with the picture cards. Note: You can also use the picture cards for the activity "Color Mats".



### Color Mats

Print the color mats and laminate or slide in a page protector. You can use these mats to sort the pictures in the activity "Color Word Sort". You can also use these to have students sort classroom objects such as bears, pom-poms, plastic snap cubes, buttons, or various items from around the classroom.



### Find and Cover

Print and laminate or slide in a page protector. Students will need manipulatives to cover their answers.


Students will identify the target color on the mat. They will determine the color represented by each picture. They will cover the pictures that show the target color.



### Magnetic Letter Mats

Print, cut, and laminate the color word cards. The cards have a hole in the upper left corner so you can punch a hole and put them on a metal ring. An optional front cover is included.


Students will use magnetic letters or dry erase markers to make or write the color words on the activity card.



### Color Clips

Print, cut apart, and laminate the activity cards. Students will need clothespins for this activity.

Students will identify the color at the top of the card. They will clip the pictures that are the target color.




### I Can Match Colors

Print, cut, and laminate the bear and cube activity pages and the optional dot cube pages, if using.

Students will identify the color of the bear/cube on the activity mat and cover it with a manipulative of the matching color.

You can also use the dot cube page to change up this activity. Students will roll a dot cube, count the dots, and refer to the key to determine which color to cover. If all of the colors have been covered, students will roll again. Students will continue to play until all of the pictures have been covered.




#### Match the Colors

Print, cut apart, and laminate the bear color mats and cube color mats. You can punch a hole in the upper left corner and put on a metal ring. There are optional covers included. Students will need manipulatives for this activity.

Students will identify the colors on the card and use manipulatives to make a matching row of colors.


Students can use bears, cubes, pom-poms - whatever you have available.



### Color Puzzles

Print, laminate, and cut apart the color puzzles.


Students will sort the puzzle pieces by color. They will work to put each puzzle together to reveal the picture.



#### Color Sentences

Print, cut apart, and laminate the sentence cards. Students can complete this activity on the floor or in a pocket chart.


Students will use the cards to put together the predictable sentences. They will match the color apple to the sentence.



#### School Sentences

Print, cut apart, and laminate the sentence cards. Students can complete this activity on the floor or in a pocket chart.

Students will use the cards to put together the predictable sentences.
They will match the color school to the sentence.



### Clip the Match

Print, cut apart, and laminate the activity cards. Students will need clothespins for this activity.

Students will identify the color on the left of the card. They will clip the color that shows the target color.
