

## Kindergarten Literacy Centers Using Spinners

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## About this Resource...

This resource includes 50 literacy centers to cover a variety of Kindergarten skills. These activities are designed to offer fun, engaging, and interactive ways to practice standards. Each activity includes teacher directions and kid-friendly "I Can" visual directions
To prep each activity you'll need to print, cut, and laminate the spinners and the corresponding recording sheet. The name of the activity is located on both the spinner and the recording sheet to keep you organized. You can use these activities as morning work bins, fast finisher activities, small group work, or as independent math stations
For most activities students will spin the spinner and find a corresponding answer on their recording sheet. They will use a color code to record or color their answers. By using a color code, you are able to check your students work You can have students use a paperclip and a pencil to make a spinner, as mentioned in the directions. If you have game spinners, you can use those as well. I got my game spinners on Amazon
You can also print this activity on color paper and have students use snap cubes to show their answer


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## Uppercase or Lowercase?

Prep Directions: Print, cut, and laminate the spinner. Print the corresponding recording sheet. Students will need crayons or markers to complete the activity and plastic spinner or a paperclip and a pencil.

Activity Directions: Students will spin the spinner to determine which space to color They will find a corresponding space on the recording sheet. They will color an uppercase or lowercase letter using the color code on the spinner. Students will continue to spin and color until all of the spaces have been colored

## Middle Sounds I

Prep Directions: Print, cut, and laminate the spinner. Print the corresponding recording sheet. Students will need crayons or markers to complete the activity and plastic spinner or a paperclip and a pencil

Activity Directions: Students will spin the spinner and identify the short vowel sound to determine which picture to color. On the recording sheet they will find a picture with the matching vowel sound. They will color the picture using the color code on the spinner. Students will continue to spin and color until all of the pictures have been colored


## Can...

I. Spin the spinner and identify the short vowel sound.

2. Use the color code on the spinner to color a picture with the matching vowel sound.



Recording Sheet: pig, top, peg, bin, ham, sum, den, mug, rib, rob, dab, wed

## Colors All Around 2

Prep Directions: Print, cut, and laminate the spinner. Print the corresponding recording sheet. Students will need crayons or markers to complete the activity and plastic spinner or a paperclip and a pencil

Activity Directions: Students will spin the spinner and identify the color word. On their recording sheet, they will find a real world object that is that color. They will color the picture using the color word/code on the spinner. Students will continue to spin and color until all of the pictures have been colored

Activity Directions: Students will spin the spinner to determine which picture to color On their recording sheet, they will find a corresponding person, place, thing, or animal They will color the picture using the color word/code on the spinner. Students will continue to spin and color until all of the pictures have been colored


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Spinner Pictures: baby, house, hippo, purse
Recording Sheet: teacher, lion, kitchen, dog, grocery store, boy, lamp, owl, clock, book, car wash, police officer
